

JSSI steering group discussion on FAST phase 3, issue 10/20-1-2004

After the attached presentation FAST report to JSSI stg Jan 20 2004_RdH.ppt, it took a full 2 hours to arrive at the following conclusions for further action

1. Output reasonable enough to go to the teams, prime objective is to get their support to get people into ANS-1
2. After consultation and feedback of the teams, we will be armed enough to ask JAAC to fund ANS-1. The consultation & feedback will help us fencing off JAAC questions like "are the recommendations covered", also AC13 recommendations will be on hold pending results of ANS-1. This way of working will give FAST an opportunity to refine the methodology as well as another check on validity of the AC-13 recommendations. [there are still doubts on some of the recommendations]
3. We will do the sectorial-, Eurocontrol SRC- and CNS-ATM steering team briefings with presentations [better because thick reports will most likely not be read].
4. The report - at issue 10 will go to CAST [some minor corrections are required - to be done by RdH - following today's & yesterday's - Kyle & Yves - comments]. CAST will have a go at some process questions like: "how do we process FAST recommendations. Remember that FAST is basically a JSAT and a JSIT working methodology to process FAST recommendations has not been developed.
5. The FAST phase 3 report was been accepted by the JSSI stg group for the purpose as indicated under 1)
6. A global presentation will be developed, action YM + RdH, Jean Teillet and others have offered assistance.

The above way forward satisfies several objectives as voiced by speakers around the table, these are

- Methodology refinement works best when mining an AoC [for AC13 we had to improvise every meeting]
- Get concurrence, not approval, we are still in "uncharted waters" and we have to respect the JAA system and its strengths.
- FAST is more of an attitude, a way of thinking, which gets promoted
- Gerard Guyot would have been very disappointed if ANS-1 would not get a go ahead [note that the original idea was to do ANS-1 & AC13 in parallel]
- Strategic advantage because this way we will get some concurrence in parallel to mining another ANS-1
- Klaus Koplín is anxious that the valuable FAST work will not be lost in the JAA→EASA transition.
- We should target to ask JAAC for ANS-1 go-ahead at the June 2004 meeting.
